

UNIONS DON'T RUN FOR RE-ELECTION

Unlike national elections, unions get a pretty sweet deal if they win your support. They don't have term limits and they don't have to run for re-election.

Once voted in, <u>the union is permanent</u> unless employees decide to go through the potentially long and difficult process called Decertification. Employees would have to petition the government for a Decertification vote – <u>while the union campaigns against them</u>.

This is **<u>VERY</u>** hard to do, and there are only occasional opportunities even to try.

You can't "try out" the union. Here's how the process works...



You'd have to wait at least ONE YEAR before attempting to remove AFSCME.



If a contract is reached, it could be up to THREE MORE YEARS before you could try to remove AFSCME.



If you missed the window for filing, it could be up to another THREE YEARS before you could try again.
